

Monthly commentary, July 2024

Equity markets were robust in July thanks to the still resilient sentiment around global economic activity and manageable inflation which fuelled rate cut expectations. However, emerging markets underperformed global markets, with Taiwan and China being the major detractors. We saw the start of a rotation out of big tech stocks with investors starting to question growth expectations and high valuations. The upcoming US election has also dominated headlines, with President Biden ending his presidential re-election campaign.

Elsewhere, the risk of a full-blown regional conflict between Israel and Iran has increased. But despite this, oil prices were down for the month. In the fund's portfolio, Chinese oil firm CNOOC followed suit and gave back some of the recent strength even though we expect it to be a good hedge if things escalate in the Middle East. The Korean cosmetics manufacturer Cosmax as well as Hyundai Motor also gave back some recent strength despite no major company-specific news.

On the positive side, we saw signs that Alibaba is now focusing more on monetisation through an adjusted merchant policy combined with major share buybacks. Brazilian logistics holding company Simpar recovered after weakness as political noise in Brazil subsided. Lastly, KB Financial delivered a strong earnings report.

The earnings season is now well underway and markets are volatile on the back of weak US jobs data, amongst other things, which has also raised concerns that the US economic slowdown might be more severe than anticipated and that the Federal Reserve may be behind the curve.

SKAGEN Kon-Tiki consists of high-quality companies with low valuations and the portfolio should be relatively resilient over time under various macro scenarios. Trading at a 2024e P/E of 7.2x compared to the MSCI EM Index at closer to 13, the fund continues to provide a very attractive risk-reward proposition.


